Area of Research: Physical activity and wellbeing through drumming

Hartpury University is pleased to offer this exciting project examining physical activity and wellbeing using drumming as part of its continued work as part of the renowned Clem Burke Drumming Project. The Clem Burke Drumming Project was co-founded by Prof Steve Draper and is a collaborative project with the University of Chichester and King's College London. Recent research from this group has demonstrated the potential physical and mental wellbeing benefits of rock and pop drumming in a range of populations including autism spectrum disorder. The successful candidate will conduct a programme of research investigating drumming as a physical activity intervention across a range of groups and special populations. The programme of work will be varied and will range from large survey work to physical activity monitoring. The aim is to produce evidence-based guidance and to support tutors to maximise the physical and mental health benefits of drumming. This position would suit a driven individual, willing to travel for data collection, with a passion for exercise, physical activity and health. A passion and interest in drumming and music is desirable but not essential.

Studentships comprise of tuition fees and a stipend of GBP £19,237 per annum tenable for 3 years. Alongside their research projects, successful candidates will be asked (as a condition of their stipend) to deliver up to 7 hours per week teaching or research support within the University.

PhD Studentship Selection Criteria:

Please demonstrate the following criteria in your CV and/or covering letter:

- Essential. Undergraduate degree or MSc in a field relating to the project
- Essential. Data collection and analysis skills

- Desirable. Skill/experience of working with others in a research setting and/or industry experience
- Ability/willingness to travel for data collection and dissemination of results

Candidates should also be aware of the following:

The normal expectation is that applicants will hold at least a 2:1 degree or a Masters qualification from a UK university or a degree of comparable standing from a university outside the UK. The candidate's degree relevant to the studentship should demonstrate their potential for physical activity research or alternative evidence of research aptitude.

Applicants whose first language is not English require a recognized English language qualification. The minimum entry requirement is GCSE English at grade C or above or IELTS score 7.0 or TOEFL score 600 (or demonstrable equivalent).

Applying for a PhD studentship

To apply for a PhD studentship you must send the following documents to RKE.Administrator@hartpury.ac.uk:

- A curriculum vitae (maximum 3 pages)
- Copies of academic transcripts
- A covering letter outlining your suitability for the studentship
- Your undergraduate or postgraduate dissertation or another relevant piece of research you have completed or contributed to.
- If English is not your first language, certification of English language qualification

Applications that do not arrive by Midnight (UK time) on 5th July 2024 will not be considered.

If your application is selected, you will be invited for interview on 15th of July 2024. All applicants must ensure their availability on this date.
